

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the April 9th, 2009, report entitled "Community Policing Partnership (CPP) Program Agreement Renewal" from Deputy Chief Paul Tetzlaff be received;

And further that, the Police Services Board endorse the Contractual Agreement between the Ministry of Community Safety and Correctional Services, the Regional Municipality of Peel and the Regional Municipality of Peel Police Services Board in respect of the Community Policing Partnerships (CPP) Program for the period April 1, 2009 through March 31, 2010;

And further that, the Executive Director of the Peel Police Services Board forward a request to Regional Council seeking a resolution authorizing execution of the Agreement by the Regional Chair on behalf of the Regional Municipality of Peel;

And further that, after execution of the Agreement by the Regional Municipality of Peel, Peel Regional Police staff shall forward the signed copies of the Agreement, a copy of the insurance certificate and a copy of the resolution from Regional Council endorsing the Agreement to the Ministry of Community Safety and Correctional Services.

REPORT HIGHLIGHTS

- Peel Regional Police receives grant funding totaling \$3,720,000 annually for 124 officers (\$30,000 per officer) under the Community Policing Partnership (CPP) Program.
- The Ministry of Community Safety and Correctional Services requires renewal of the contract every 2 years; however this year, the Ministry has forwarded a new one year agreement effective April 1st, 2009, and expiring March 31st, 2010, for execution.
- This one year agreement will align the renewal dates for the Community Policing Partnership Program along with the Safer Communities – 1,000 Officers Partnership Program.

DISCUSSION

Peel Regional Police receives grant funding totaling \$3,720,000 for 124 officers (\$30,000 per officer) under the Community Policing Partnership (CPP) Program. Appendix A attached provides historic background information on the grant. While the program is a permanent program, the Ministry of Community Safety and Correctional Services requires renewal of the contract every 2 years.

This year, the Ministry has forwarded a one year agreement effective April 1st, 2009, and expiring March 31st, 2010, for execution. The one year renewal term will permit the Ministry to streamline their processes so that the CPP Program and the Safer Communities – 1,000 Officers Partnership Program can be aligned and renewed on the same date in the future. By extending the CPP contract for a one-year term, the Ministry will be in a position to combine both contracts upon expiry on March 31, 2010.

In accordance with Section 3.4 of the Agreement, a copy of which is filed with the Board office, the Ministry will not provide funding until Municipal Council provides a by-law or resolution authorizing the Municipality to enter into this Agreement with the Ministry. As a result, upon Board approval of the Agreement, a request must be forwarded to Regional Council for a resolution authorizing the Regional Municipality of Peel to enter into this Agreement with the Ministry.

A Certificate of Insurance, as required under section 11.0 of the Agreement, has been obtained and will be forwarded to the Ministry along with the three copies of the signed Agreements once Regional Council has passed the resolution.

APPENDIX I

Community Policing Partnership Program - Background Information

In 1998, the Province of Ontario implemented a new five-year Community Policing Partnership (CPP) Program in which funding was allocated amongst Ontario police services to assist in hiring 1,000 additional front-line police officers. The CPP Program reimburses police services for 50% of salary, overtime and benefit costs to a maximum of \$30,000 per officer. Peel Regional Police applied for 257 positions and was granted 123, upon which time the Peel Regional Police Services Board entered into a five-year Agreement with the Ministry of Community Safety and Correctional Services in order to share the cost of 123 additional front-line officer's salaries. In 2000, Peel Regional Police was allocated 1 additional officer bringing the total officers hired under the Agreement to 124.

During the transition process of hiring and training the additional front-line officers between 1998 and 1999, the Ministry provided Peel Regional Police \$957,572 to fund a transitional paid duty program in order to meet the goals and objectives of the CPP program.

Hiring of the additional 124 officers was completed in May 2000. As the new hires progressed from Recruit to 1st Class Officer, the funding claimed from the Ministry reached the maximum allowed per officer in March 2003. Since that time, Peel Regional Police receives the maximum allowable funding in the amount of \$3,720,000 (\$30,000 x 124 officers) each year under the Agreement. Since the program's inception in 1998, CPP grant funding to Peel Regional Police has totaled \$35.3 million.

As announced in the Ontario Budget 2000 speech, and confirmed by the Manager of the Program Support Section within the Ministry's Policing Services Division, the CPP Program was made permanent in 2000.
