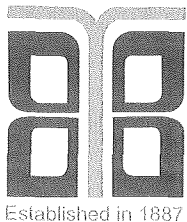

Dear Mayor Fennell and Chairman Kolb,

This resolution of The Brampton Board of Trade Governing Council was approved on January 26, 2011:

Whereas there is a clear need for the City of Brampton to establish the office of an Integrity Commissioner;

Whereas the City of Brampton currently has a unanimously passed motion that has assigned the Brampton City Manager to report back to Brampton City Council with recommendations to establish an Integrity Commissioner;

Whereas the Brampton Board of Trade (BBOT) is supportive of the establishment of the office of an Integrity Commissioner;

Whereas the BBOT recognizes the inherent costs associated with the establishment of an Integrity Commissioner and the obstacles that these costs can present;

Whereas the BBOT recognizes that the Municipalities of Mississauga and Caledon as well as the Region of Peel also have a need for an Integrity Commissioner;

The BBOT moves that is it our position that the City of Brampton should enter into discussions with and consider a joint Integrity Commissioner with above mentioned governments whose responsibility and scope would include the governance of the Region of Peel and all three municipalities (Brampton, Mississauga, Caledon).

We believe that under the Municipal Act 2001, **Joint undertakings**, municipalities could enter into an agreement with another municipality

20. (1) A municipality may enter into an agreement with one or more municipalities or local bodies, as defined in section 19, or a combination of both to jointly provide, for their joint benefit, any matter which all of them have the power to provide within their own boundaries.

(2) The municipality may provide the matter in accordance with the agreement anywhere that any of the municipalities or local bodies have the power to provide the matter.

I hope you will consider a cross-appointment.
