**Subject: TransCanada's Proposed King's North Connection Project**

TransCanada is proposing to construct and operate the King's North Connection project, an approximately 13 kilometre, 36 inch diameter natural gas pipeline located within the cities of Brampton, Toronto and Vaughan in the area of Highway 50, 407 and 427. This new pipeline is required to reliably serve homes, business, schools and hospitals in Ontario and Eastern Canada with a diverse, flexible supply of natural gas.

In support of our application to the National Energy Board, we are starting preliminary research. We have met with representatives from the City of Toronto, City of Brampton, City of Vaughan, York Region and Peel Region. Shortly, we will commence meetings with the landowners involved as well as other stakeholders. We are providing you with information about our plans at this time to make you are aware of our proposal at this early stage in the process. Once the landowners have been contacted by our Land Representatives, we will provide notification of the project to a wider audience of potentially impacted stakeholders through advertisements and mailings to ensure they have an opportunity to provide their comments on the proposal.

Please find enclosed a fact sheet which provides information about the project as well as public consultation, the proposed project schedule, route selection and a project overview map.

# TransCanada's Proposed King's North Connection Project

TransCanada is developing the proposed King's North Connection project, an approximately 13 kilometre, 36 inch diameter natural gas pipeline located within the cities of Brampton, Toronto and Vaughan in the area of Highways 50, 407 and 427. This proposed new pipeline is required to reliably serve homes, businesses, schools and hospitals in Ontario and Eastern Canada with a diverse, flexible supply of natural gas.

The proposed pipeline route is planned to be constructed within a new right-of-way and will interconnect new natural gas facilities proposed by Enbridge with TransCanada's existing pipeline infrastructure. The route will be located primarily east of Highway 50 and Huntington Road in Vaughan. From a new Enbridge meter station at Albion Road in Toronto, the proposed route will briefly cross Highway 50 (Albion Road) into Brampton before crossing back into Vaughan. At the north end, the route will cross Huntington Road towards Major Mackenzie Drive. A new tie-in connection is anticipated at the west end of Enbridge's proposed Segment A pipeline.

TransCanada believes that stakeholder and Aboriginal input is a critical part of developing project plans. We are committed to engaging with the community to provide them with information about the proposed project and include their input in our planning. We will be meeting with local stakeholders over the coming weeks and anticipate holding a public open house this winter to further discuss this proposed project. A more defined route for the proposed King's North Connection will be determined after stakeholder engagement, environmental studies and facility engineering activities have been undertaken in support of our application to the National Energy Board (NEB).

## Proposed Project Schedule:

- Q4 2013 Stakeholder engagement begins
- Q4 2013 Environmental studies and route refinement begin
- Q3 2014 Application submitted to the NEB
- Q2 2015 Pending approvals, construction begins
- Q4 2015 Construction complete and line in service
