In 1974, the Regional Municipality of Peel was incorporated based on the principle that certain community and infrastructure services, such as community health, social assistance, water and sanitary sewers and waste collection, are more cost effectively administered over a larger geographic area.

Peel is governed by the Regional Chair and a 24-member Council, representing its member municipalities. The current Regional Council was elected in November 2006 and the 25 members will serve for a four-year term to 2010.

Situated in the heart of southern Ontario's major urban centres, Peel is the second largest municipality in Ontario with a population of 1.2 million. Peel's population is expected to grow by over 370,000 people between now and 2031. With a rich cultural heritage, extensive rural areas and dynamic urban centres, Peel is one of Canada's fastest growing municipalities. Comprising the Cities of Brampton and Mississauga and the Town of Caledon, the Region of Peel delivers essential municipal services such as:
