Options to Order Publicly Funded Vaccines:

1. Phone Order
2. Fax Order
3. Online Order 

1. Phone Order

To order vaccines by phone, please call the Peel Health vaccine order desk at **(905)791-7800 ext. 6404**.

2. Fax Order

To place a vaccine order by fax, send order form to **(905)793-2114**.

See the attachment for an updated vaccine order form for faxing purposes. Please discard all old vaccine order forms and replace with the one attached.

3. New: Online Vaccine Order Form

Peel Public Health now offers doctors an online option for ordering publicly funded vaccines by linking to:

Follow these steps to order vaccines online:

- a) Go to <http://peelregion.ca/health/vaccines/>
- b) The link to the order form is located at the bottom of the page.
- c) You will be taken to a login page (for security purposes).
- d) Type in the password vaccines6404 and this will take you to the online order form.
- e) Enter the contact information in the appropriate field at the top of the page.
- f) Select the Peel Health location where you will be picking up your vaccine. (By clicking the address of each clinic, another window

will pop-up showing a map of the clinic location).

- g) Fill out your vaccine order specifying number of packages ordered (not doses).
- h) Once completed, click on the "send order" button. All mandatory fields must be completed in order for the order form to be submitted.
- i) A notice confirming receipt of your order will appear in a new window after the order is submitted.

A hardcopy of your vaccine order can be printed off for your reference.

Vaccine orders will be available for pick-up within 2 business days.

To change or cancel an order, you must call the Vaccine Order Desk at **(905) 791-7800 ext. 6404**.

Hepatitis A and B vaccine orders must be called into the Vaccine Order Desk.

Possible Food Contamination by E. coli and Salmonella Bacteria

Two Health Hazard Alerts were issued by the Canadian Food Inspection Agency:

1. The public has been advised not to consume various brands of fresh spinach packaged in the United States because the products may contain E. coli O157:H7 bacteria.
2. The public has been warned not to consume Wendy's Homestyle Croutons because the product may be contaminated with Salmonella.

Health care providers are asked to monitor patients for symptoms of E. coli and Salmonella and to report any findings to Peel Public Health at 905 799 7700.
