Woman abuse is a growing public health concern, which results in both short and long-term adverse effects on women's physical and psychological health.

Since 2003, Peel Health has worked in collaboration with the College of Family Physicians and other community partners to plan, implement and evaluate CME certified skill building workshops and education rounds on the issue of woman abuse.

In 2004, Peel Health conducted an in-depth audience analysis of health professionals to explore their ideas, issues and needs with regards to the issue of woman abuse. The findings highlighted the need for an innovative and practical screening tool for use in health care settings. In response to these findings, Peel Health developed and distributed the ***Abuse Screening Kit – ASK*** in 2005. This resource was developed to support and assist physicians and other health care professionals to identify and respond to women who are experiencing abuse.
