Diseases listed on the back in bold and with an ► should be reported immediately to Peel Public Health at 905-799-7700. This will enable Peel Public Health staff to begin immediate investigation.

\* Although not on the list of reportable diseases, Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) infection is also reportable to the Medical Officer of Health since it is the agent responsible for AIDS.
