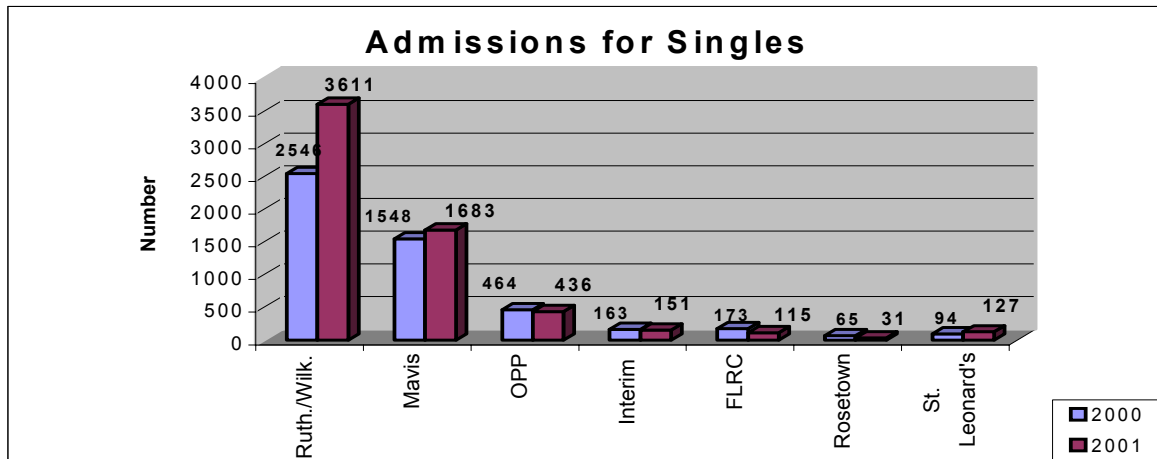

2001 HOSTEL PROGRAM STATISTICS-EMERGENCY SINGLE SHELTERS

The following provides a brief statistical summary of 2001 admissions to the single oriented shelter facilities operated in the Region of Peel.



- 6,154 admissions were admitted to single shelter beds in the Region of Peel in 2001. In 2000, 5,053 single admissions were admitted. This represents a 22% increase from 2000 to 2001.
- In 2001, 4,314 of the admissions were male and 1,840 were female.
- Of the 4,314 single males admitted, 18 declared to be abused and 17 of the abused males were placed at Our Place (Peel) and 1 was placed at the Rosetown Inn.
- Of the 1,840 single females admitted, 304 declared fleeing abusive situations.
- In 2001, 3,611 homeless individuals were admitted to the Wilkinson Road shelter, 645 females and 2,966 males. 1,683 homeless individuals were admitted to the Mavis Road shelter, 688 females and 995 males.
- Our Place (Peel) admitted 436 cases in 2001 compared to 464 cases admitted in 2000, a decrease of 28 cases or 6%. Of the 436 cases admitted, 214 were female and 222 were male.
- FLRC admitted 115 single females in 2001, 80 were admitted due to fleeing abusive situations and 35 due to homelessness. In 2000, FLRC admitted 173 cases, 160 single female admissions of which 87 were admitted due to fleeing abusive situations, and 13 males in the months of January and February prior to changing the mandate to only admit single females. An overall decrease of 58 cases or 34%.
- Interim Place 1 & 11 admitted 151 single females, 147 declared to be fleeing abusive situations. In 2000, of the 163 single females admitted, 148 were admitted who declared the reason for admission as fleeing abusive situations. This reflects a decrease in 2001 of 12 cases or 7%.
- In 2001, The Rosetown Inn admitted 31 single cases, 27 females and 4 males. This reflects a decrease in 2001 of 34 cases or 52%.
- St. Leonard's admitted a total of 127 single males in 2001. An increase of 33 cases or 35%.

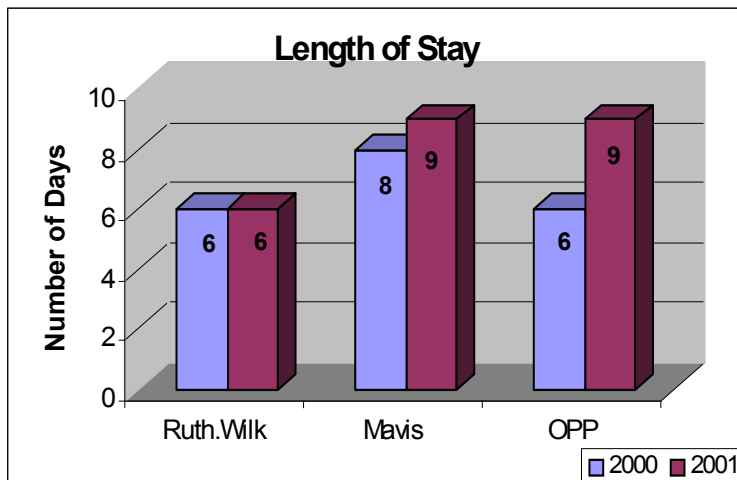

- New admissions (37% of all admissions) reflects those unique individuals who sought emergency housing at Mavis or Wilkinson Rd. shelters
- Ongoing admissions (6%) reflects those individuals whose stay carried over from one month to the next month
- # of individuals who returned (27%) reflects those individuals who were discharged and readmitted within the same month
- Repeat admissions (30%) reflects the number of residents who returned to the shelter(s) throughout the year

Length of Stay:



- The average length of stay at the Rutherford/Wilkinson Road shelter remains unchanged from 2000 to 2001 at 6 days.
- The average length of stay at the Mavis Road shelter increased by 13% from 2000 to 2001.
- The average length of stay at Our Place (Peel) increased by 50% from 2000 to 2001.

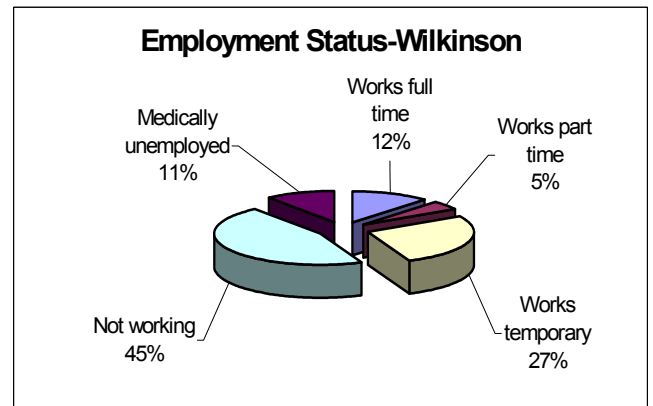
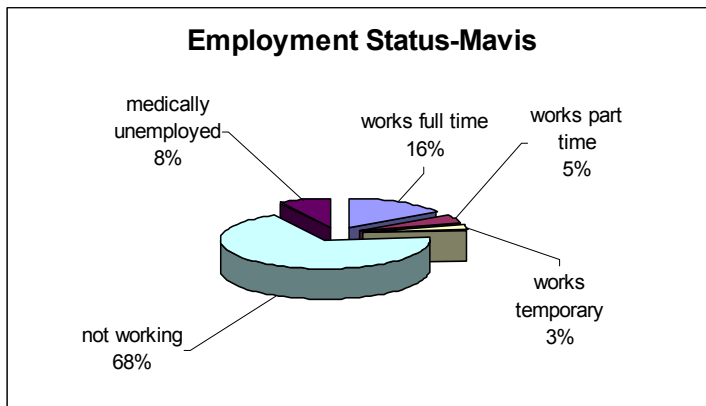

- Included in the Reason for Admissions category 'other/unknown' are those individuals who have transferred from another shelter, in the process of relocating, as well, those who experienced problems with accommodations
- Included in the Reason for Discharges category 'other/unknown' are those individuals who left the shelter to go to another shelter and those individuals who were institutionalized (hospitalized, incarcerated or entered a rehabilitation centre)

Employment Status:



- A total of 24% of those admitted to the Mavis Road shelter declared to be employed in some capacity. At the Wilkinson Road shelter, a total of 44% declared to be employed in some capacity.
- Of the 76% at Mavis who were not employed, 68% declared to be employable and actively seeking employment. At the Wilkinson Rd. shelter a total of 56% declared to be employable and actively seeking employment.
