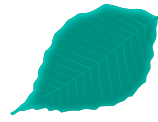


Conservation Day

Conservation Day is hosted by the Region of Peel. Residents are encouraged to safely drop off their household hazardous waste, electronics, confidential fine paper for shredding and reusable items that are in good condition.



Day

Only the following items are accepted at Conservation Day (unaccepted items must be taken back by the resident or taken to a Community Recycling Centre for disposal):

Household Hazardous Waste (all items MUST be in sealed and labelled containers)	Electronics* (all types and parts)	Reusable Goods*
all batteries syringes (in hard-shell plastic containers) household cleaners medicine paint and solvents propane tanks (max. 18 kg/40 lbs.) motor oil aerosol cans engine coolant fertilizers and pesticides	cash registers computers fax machines modems monitors phones printers/scanners VCRs NO TVs *Please remove all batteries and toner cartridges before dropping off electronics.	clothing furniture housewares books small appliances electronics *Goodwill accepts items at its own discretion. Please donate items that are gently used and in good condition.
