2013 Water and Wastewater Master Plan for the Lake-Based Systems

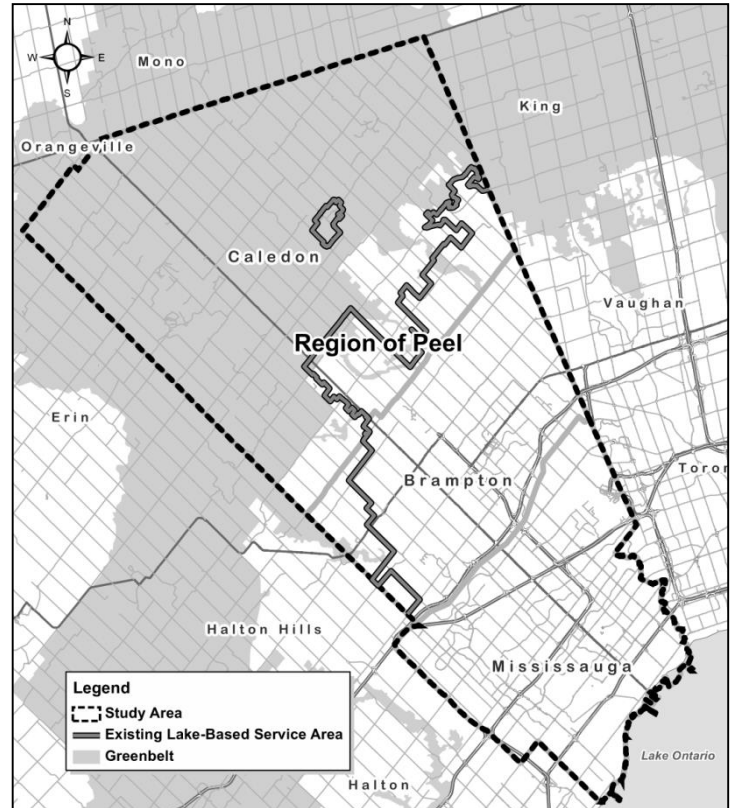
The Study

The Region of Peel has completed a Water and Wastewater Master Plan for its lake-based systems (where Lake Ontario is the source of drinking water and the discharge point for treated wastewater) to update the current 2007 Master Plan.

The study has identified long-term servicing plans for the Region's lake-based water and wastewater systems to support growth to 2031 and considers longer-term servicing needs for growth beyond 2031, as identified by Amendment 2 (2013) of the Growth Plan for the Greater Golden Horseshoe, 2006.

The study area for the Water and Wastewater Master Plan includes the City of Mississauga, the City of Brampton and parts of the Town of Caledon.

The study also reviewed the Region's capital plan to meet the current servicing agreements with York Region and the City of Toronto.



The Process

The study has defined existing problems and opportunities, considered and evaluated solutions and identified preferred water and wastewater servicing strategies. The study follows the Master Planning Process of the Municipal Engineers Association. The Master Plan follows Approach #2 which will fulfill the requirements for Schedule A, A+, and select Schedule B projects and become the basis for future investigations for specific Schedule C projects. Two public information centres were held on February 2012 and November 2013 as part of the Class EA process and are documented in the report.

Completion

The Class EA Report for the 2013 Master Plan has been prepared to document the planning and decision making process undertaken for this study. By this notice, the report is being placed on the public record for a 30-day review period (starting March 31, 2014 and ending May 1, 2014) in accordance with the requirements of the Municipal Class EA. The preliminary preferred water and wastewater servicing strategy has identified two (2) Schedule B projects whose requirements are being satisfied under this Master Plan. These projects are described as follows:

Wastewater Projects

- 1500-mm diameter twinning of the Lakeshore/Southdown Road Sanitary Trunk Sewer (Clarkson Road to the Clarkson WWTP)
- 900-mm diameter forcemain from the McVean Pumping Station along Queen Street East to Goreway Drive

Representatives from the Region and its consultants are available to provide further information. If concerns regarding this project cannot be resolved in discussion with the Region of Peel, a person or party may request that the Minister of Environment make an order for the project to comply with Part II of the Environmental Assessment Act (referred to as a Part II Order).
