Thank you for your letter dated October 14, 2009, related to the above-noted project.

The Canadian Environmental Assessment Act (the Act), applies to federal authorities when they contemplate certain action or decisions in relation to a project that would enable it to proceed in whole or in part. A federal environmental assessment (EA) may be required when a federal authority:

- a) is the proponent of the project;
- b) provides financial assistance to the proponent;
- c) sells, leases or otherwise disposes of federal lands; or
- d) issues a permit, licence or any other approval as prescribed in the Law List Regulations.

In the case of projects that are subject to the Ontario *Environmental Assessment Act*, if there is uncertainty as to whether the Act may also apply, the Agency can help proponents answer this question. For projects that are subject to the Act, the Agency will act as the federal environmental assessment coordinator and facilitate the involvement of the federal authorities in a co-ordinated assessment aimed at meeting all agencies' needs simultaneously.

In order for the Agency to undertake either of these roles, it must have a project description that can be distributed to various federal authorities to determine their interest in the project. It is recognized that at the early stages of the planning process, there may not be much detailed information to provide. However, proponents should try to provide some information on:

- the nature of the project and its location;
- federal decisions which may be made in relation to the project;
- whether federal funding is being contemplated or federal lands are required.

We have received notice of the EA noted above. TransCanada has one high pressure natural gas pipeline crossing Bovaird Drive West between Mississauga Rd. and Heritage Rd. TransCanada reviews all development within 200 metres of its facilities to ensure that it does not affect the safety and integrity of those facilities.

Please be advised of the following TransCanada and National Energy Board requirements for any development in close proximity to the pipeline for consideration in the EA Report:

- 1. All crossings of the pipeline right-of-way by any facility as defined by the National Energy Board (NEB) Regulation 112 must have TransCanada's prior written authorisation. A crossing facility may include but is not limited to driveways, roads, access ramps, trails, pathways or utilities. In accordance with the NEB Act, the owner may be required to enter into a crossing agreement with TransCanada prior to the construction of any facility. The owner agrees to meet all clearances and design requirements outlined in the crossing agreement and the NEB Pipeline Crossing Regulations.
- 2. Any grading not otherwise permitted by the NEB Act or Crossing Regulations, that will affect the right-of-way or drainage onto it, regardless of whether or not the grading is conducted on the right-of-way, must receive TransCanada's prior written approval. Grading activities on the right-of-way will only be permitted when a TransCanada representative is present to inspect and supervise them.



- 5. The Owner shall ensure through all contracts entered into, that all contractors and subcontractors are aware of and observe the foregoing terms and conditions.





We are in receipt of a Notice of Study Commencement for the above noted project. Please be advised that our review of your project relates to the *Endangered Species Act 2007*. This review does not eliminate the requirement to obtain any other permits or approvals for any legislation other than the *Endangered Species Act 2007*.

Your project has the potential to impact fisheries resources in Huttonville Creek. As you may know, Huttonville Creek supports the provincially endangered Redside Dace (*Clinostomas elongatus*), a small species of fish with a limited distribution in Canada. At the location of your project, Bovaird Drive crosses a reach of Huttonville Creek that is currently occupied by the species. The species and its habitat are protected under the *Endangered Species Act 2007*. The general habitat protection provision of Ontario's *Endangered Species Act* provides protection for areas on which the species depends, directly or indirectly, to carry on its life processes.

Please consult with MNR staff at this office to insure impacts to the species and its habitat resulting from your project are avoided. If impacts to the species and its habitat can not be avoided, a permit under section 17 of the *Endangered Species Act 2007* will be required.

Thank you for your letter with respect to the Class Environmental Assessment for the Class EA Bovaird Dr from Lake Louise Dr to 1.45km west of Heritage Road, Peel Region. From your letter, it is my understanding that the project is at an early stage within the Class EA process, however I would like to flag some important information that may or may not apply to this specific project:

As part of the Class Environmental Assessment process, the Ministry of Culture has an interest in the conservation of cultural heritage resources including:

- Archaeological resources;
- · Built heritage resources; and
- Cultural heritage landscapes.

The Provincial Policy Statement, 2005 issued under the authority of the Planning Act defines "conserved" as "the identification, protection, use and/or management of cultural heritage and archaeological resources in such a way that their heritage values, attributes and integrity are retained. This may be addressed through a conservation plan or heritage impact assessment."

Archaeology:

The site in question has archaeological potential for the following reasons... (Red = It applies to this project)

- Please consider the provision of access to the City property, 2719 Bovaird Drive West, for future expansion of the
 facility. The City also wants to explore an opportunity to get water service extended along Bovaird as part of this
 project. This would allow for service to the City property, 2719 Bovaird Drive West.
- Please assess trucking impacts on Bovaird Drive in light of the proposed shale extraction site northeast of Norval.
- The Pathways master plan identifies a 3.0 m multiuse trail along Bovaird Drive. At present, the multiuse trail is on the north side of Bovaird Dr, East of Chinguacousy Rd. Preference would be to continue on the north side.

- There is a future park planned for the southeast corner of Mississauga Road and Bovaird Drive. However, there has been some talk in the past with the Peel Region District School Board about flipping sites so that the school is at the southeast corner of Mississauga Road and Bovaird Drive and the park is adjacent to the south. Now that the respective plans in this area of CVSP Blocks 1 & 3 are beginning to advance, further talks may resume.
- The scope of the study extends across the Credit River into Norval. A satisfactory bridge structure and
 preservation and restoration at the river crossing should be identified.
- Brampton Transit currently operates a number of services within the study area, primarily to and from the Mount
 Pleasant GO Station across the Bovaird Drive Corridor and through the adjacent residential areas to the east and
 south. In the future, transit services are planned to extend to the west along the Bovaird Drive corridor, including

a future planned Bus Rapid Transit corridor along Bovaird Drive to Mississauga Road. As such, we would like the opportunity to review and comment on the preliminary preferred design from a transit planning perspective.

- Please forward us the following draft materials and allow reasonable time for our review and comments prior to presenting to the public.
 - o PIC materials.
 - o Preliminary design drawings before and after PIC meetings.
 - Two hard copies of Draft ESR including appendices for review prior to filing. Final ESR including appendices in hardcopy and in CD.
 - o Any other report/materials that may identify impact to the City's interests.
- I will be the primary contact from the City of Brampton for technical matters and will be co-ordinating comments from other City Departments. However, please maintain direct contact with Councillors, Mayor, Emergency Services (Police, Fire, Ambulance etc.), Boards/Commissions/Committees and others from the City/Region as required under EA consultation. Please add me in your project mailing list as well as in the invitation list of regular Technical Steering / Agencies Committee meetings and send us invitations for dry-run PICs / project team meeting(s) prior to PICs. Based on meeting agenda and outstanding issues at the time of invitation, we will also forward the invitation to other appropriate City staff to attend these meetings. If there are no technical meetings scheduled, we suggest that Region set-up separate meetings with City staff prior to PIC and finalizing design.


