## Public Works

### Region of Peel Traffic By-law Amendment – Speed Limit Reductions on Britannia Road in the Area East of Streetsville to Heartland, City of Mississauga

Regional Council approved By-law 18-2018 to reduce the existing 60 kilometre per hour posted speed limit on Britannia Road (Regional Road 3) to 50 kilometres per hour from 195 m west of Tillsdown Road/River Grove to 70 metres east of Creditview Road. The existing 70 kilometre posted speed limit on Britannia Road from 70 meetings east of Creditview Road to 70 metres east of Terry Fox Way/Silken Laumann Way, was reduced to 60 kilometres per hour.

### Region of Peel Traffic By-law Amendment – Westbound Left Turn Prohibition – Steeles Avenue at Churchville Road Intersection

Regional Council approved By-law 19-2018 to implement a left turn prohibition on Steeles Avenue West (Regional Road 15) at Churchville Road intersection in the morning (7:00 – 9:00) and afternoon (3:00 – 6:00) peak periods from Monday to Friday, buses excepted.

The residents of Churchville Village requested that City of Brampton and Region of Peel staff consider a westbound left turn prohibition to mitigate the traffic infiltration issues within the village. City of Brampton staff are in the process of implementing “speed cushions” in the village on a permanent basis along Churchville Road. To discourage traffic infiltration into the village along with the “speed cushions”, the Region of Peel was requested to implement a left turn prohibition during peak periods.

**2017 Region of Peel United Way Campaign**

Regional Council received a report on the results of the 2017 Region of Peel United Way Campaign. The Campaign raised \$337,520, exceeding its \$280,000 goal. Combined funds raised by the Region of Peel and Peel Regional Police resulted in a total contribution to the United Way of \$399,262.

**Regional Chair Election Compliance Audit Committee**

Regional Council passed a resolution to establish a Peel Election Compliance Audit Committee for the Office of Regional Chair position.

The *Municipal Elections Act* requires municipalities to establish a compliance audit committee for each municipal election. In the past, each local municipality within the Region of Peel established its own compliance audit committee. With the approval of Bill 70, the *Municipal Act* was amended to provide that the head of Council of an upper tier municipality shall be elected by general vote. The establishment of a committee for the Region of Peel will be to hear and consider matters pertaining to the Regional Chair position only.

Regional Council delegated authority to the Regional Clerk to advertise for applicants, review applications, conduct interviews and appoint members to the Committee.
