Dementia Care Butterfly Care Model

Regional Council passed a resolution approving the implementation of the Dementia Butterfly Care Model in dedicated units for people living in the advanced stages of dementia across all five Peel Long Term Care centres. The Butterfly Care Model is a nationally accredited culture change model that strives to make living environments for people living in the advanced stages of dementia enriching, engaging and more home-like. The Model emphasizes a transformation in the way people living with dementia are cared for, with a focus on their emotions and the creation of home-like environments and everyday activities they enjoyed earlier in life.

The Region of Peel is the first long term care provider in Ontario to begin the journey of transitioning one unit at the Malton Village Long Term Care centre into a Butterfly home. The one-year pilot at Malton Village has delivered significant improvements in quality indicators for care and experience, such as higher levels of engagement, lower levels of worsened depression and lower levels of antipsychotic medication use without a diagnosis for psychosis for people living in the Butterfly Home.

Regional Council heard from family members of residents about the positive impact the Butterfly Model has had on their loved ones.

Regional Council also heard from Dr. David Sheard, Chief Executive Officer, Dementia Care Matters, who advised that Malton Village’s Butterfly home is a remarkable achievement and a testament to the leadership, staff and families who have changed their belief system about dementia care.

Dementia Care Matters will be presenting the Butterfly Model of Care to senior provincial health care leaders to promote its importance to the future of long term care.

“Demand the Right” Campaign, Giving Municipalities the Right to Say Yes or No to Proposed Landfills Planned in their Boundaries

Regional Council passed a resolution calling upon the Government of Ontario, and all political parties, to formally grant municipalities the authority to approve landfill projects in or adjacent to their municipalities.

Regional Council received a delegation from Ted Comiskey, Mayor, Town of Ingersoll, who explained that while municipalities have authority to make decisions on developments in their communities, they do not have the right to approve or deny landfill projects, as part of the current Ministry of the Environment and Climate Change approval process.

The Mayor of Ingersoll invited Regional Council to join the “Demand the Right” campaign by passing the resolution, noting that to date, 50 municipalities have approved motions; 150 municipal leaders have signed
