Key Messages:

- The Brampton Multi-Service Clinic will be relocating to 10 Peel Centre Drive. The clinic will be closed from Wednesday July 19, 2023, to Monday August 7, 2023, inclusive and will re-open at its new location on Tuesday August 8, 2023.

Vaccine Pick-up in Brampton

- Brampton vaccine pick-up will **not** be available from **Saturday July 15, 2023, to Monday August 7, 2023**, inclusive.
 - Due to the closure of the facilities at 150 Central Park Drive, last day of vaccine pick-up at this location will be **Friday July 14, 2023**.
 - Vaccine orders **not** picked up by **Friday July 14, 2023**, will be available for pick-up at 7120 Hurontario Street, Mississauga.
 - If picking up from 7120 Hurontario Street, enter building from the entrance on the parking lot (west side) of the building.
 - Advise staff at the Access Peel desk that you are there for vaccine pick-up and provide your facility's RMP code.
 - Bring your pre-conditioned (+2 °C to +8°C) cooler with temperature monitoring device to transport the vaccine.
- Brampton vaccine pick-up will commence on **Tuesday August 8, 2023**, at Peel Public Health's NEW Multi-Service Clinic at 10 Peel Centre Drive, Brampton.
- The option on the vaccine order form to pick-up vaccine at the new 10 Peel Centre Drive, Brampton location will be available starting **Wednesday August 2, 2023**.

Relocation of Peel Public Health's Multi-Service Clinic in Brampton

Peel Public Health's Multi-Service Clinic in Brampton located at 150 Central Park Drive is relocating to 10 Peel Centre Drive, Suite A, Suite 101, Brampton, ON, L6T 4B9. The new multi-service clinic will open on **Tuesday August 8, 2023**.

To accommodate the relocation, the clinic will be fully closed from **Wednesday July 19, 2023, to Monday August 7, 2023**, inclusive for the move.

UPDATE: Ministry of Health COVID-19 Vaccine Guidance

In the coming months, original monovalent (non-Omicron containing) mRNA COVID-19 vaccines will no longer be available in Ontario. The monovalent vaccines will be removed from Peel’s primary care:

The National Advisory Committee on Immunization (NACI) made interim off-label recommendations considering the use of currently available bivalent Omicron-containing vaccines for the primary series on June 9, 2023.

The Ministry of Health has updated the guidance with the following:

- As monovalent mRNA vaccines will no longer be available, bivalent mRNA vaccines will be used for a primary series. This is both to start a primary series or to complete it in individuals six months of age and older.

Table 1: Primary series - Interim recommendations for bivalent COVID-19 mRNA vaccine product preferences by age.

Age	Product Preference (mcg/ml)
6 months – 4 years	Bivalent Moderna (25 mcg/0.25 mL) is the recommended and only bivalent product for this age group.
5 – 11 years	No preference between bivalent Pfizer-BioNTech (10 mcg/0.2 mL) or bivalent Moderna (25 mcg/0.25 mL)
12 – 29 years	Bivalent Pfizer-BioNTech (30 mcg/0.3 mL)
30 years and older	No preference between bivalent Pfizer-BioNTech (30 mcg/0.3 mL) or bivalent Moderna (50 mcg/0.5 mL)

- Individuals five years and older should consider delaying receipt of a COVID-19 vaccine booster until Fall 2023, as respiratory season commences, to maximize protection against COVID-19 outcomes when peak circulation of the virus is expected.
- The indication for use of bivalent Moderna BA.4/5 has been extended, and now includes individuals 6 to 17 years for use as a booster.
- The COVID-19 Janssen vaccine has been removed as an available vaccine option in Canada.
 - Janssen Inc. has submitted a voluntary recall to Health Canada for the JCOVDEN (Janssen) COVID-19 vaccine and states that the decision to withdraw this product from use in Canada is a business decision and is NOT the result of any health or safety concerns related to the vaccine.
