### Product Selection for Adults ≥65 years of age

There is evidence to support the use of QIV-HD product, where available, in adults >65 years of age as it provides better protection against influenza compared to the QIV product. However, the QIV, QIV-HD and TIV-adj all protect against influenza, and the most important thing is for older adults to be vaccinated. Do not delay vaccination to wait for a particular influenza product.

#### Dosage by Age

Dosage (IM)	No. of Doses Required
0.5 mL	1 or 2*

0.7 mL (QIV-HD ≥ 65 vears)

\*Previously unvaccinated children 6 months to 8 years of age require 2 doses with an interval of 4 weeks.

QIV products are interchangeable; however, it is preferable to complete a 2-dose series with the same product. If the vaccine used for the first dose is not available, the 2-dose series may be completed with a different age-appropriate brand.

#### **General Influenza Vaccine Reminders**

- Any of the QIV products can be administered to pregnant individuals.
- Any of the influenza vaccines can be administered to egg allergic individuals.
- Multidose vials can be used for 28 days after they have been punctured.
- Patients should only receive one dose of influenza vaccine per season (exception: children 6 months

to 8 years of age getting the vaccine for the first time).

# New: RSV Vaccine for Seniors

The Ontario Ministry of Health has announced it will roll out the RSV vaccine (Arexvy) to individuals  $\geq$  60 years of age who live in long-term care homes, Elder Care Lodges and some retirement homes this fall. It will not be publicly funded for individuals residing in the community.

Primary care providers can discuss the option to privately purchase Arexvy for their patients. However, there are currently no recommendations from the National Advisory Committee on Immunization or the Ministry on the broader use of the vaccine in the community. The Arexvy vaccine will not be available at PPH clinics.

#### **Product Information:**

- Indicated for adults  $\geq$  60 years of age.
- Administered as a single dose of 0.5 mL.
- Requires reconstitution.
- A 14-day period is recommended between receiving Arexvy and any other vaccine, such as COVID-19 and influenza, so that any adverse effects following the vaccination can be better monitored and managed.
