Revised: Ministry of Health Guidance for Routine & Catch-Up Immunization Services

The Ministry of Health has updated the Guidance for Routine & Catch-up Immunization Services, available at:

It includes guidance related to:

- Groups requiring routine immunizations
- Provision of catch-up vaccines for missed doses (includes information on pneumococcal and tetanus-containing vaccines)
- Extended vaccine eligibility for some publicly funded vaccines

Shingles Vaccine- Extended Eligibility

Shingles vaccine (Shingrix) is publicly funded for individuals 65-70 years of age.

Eligibility has been extended for individuals born in 1949, 1950, 1951, 1952 and 1953. Prioritize patients in this age group. They will remain eligible for missed doses until December 31, 2024. Shingles vaccine can be ordered at:

High Risk Programs- Extended Eligibility

Eligibility under the HPV-9, 4CMenB and Men-C-ACYW135 high risk programs has been extended. These individuals will remain eligible for missed doses until **December 31, 2024**.

School-Based Immunization Program- Extended Eligibility

The Guidance for Routine and Catch-Up Immunization Services provides information related to extended eligibility for students that did not complete their school-based immunizations in previous academic years.

Note: The following birth cohorts remain eligible until **August 31, 2024:**

Hepatitis B

Born in 2005 or 2006 (males and females)

HPV-9

- Born in 2002, 2003 (females only)
- Born in 2004, 2005 or 2006 (males and females)

NEW: NOVAVAX (Nuvaxovid) XBB COVID-19 vaccine

On December 5, 2023, Health Canada authorized the updated Novavax (Nuvaxovid) XBB COVID-19 vaccine for use for individuals 12 years of age and older.

The Novavax (Nuvaxovid) XBB COVID-19 vaccine is a an option for individuals unable, due to contraindications, or not willing to receive an mRNA COVID-19 vaccine.

The Novavax (Nuvaxovid) XBB COVID-19 vaccine may be given to people who have been previously vaccinated or who have not been previously vaccinated.

On December 22, 2023, the Ministry of Health updated the COVID-19 Vaccine Administration Guidance with information on the Novavax (Nuvaxovid) XBB COVID-19 vaccine. The full document can be accessed at: https://www.ontario.ca/page/covid-19-vaccine-program

The Novavax (Nuvaxovid) XBB COVID-19 vaccine will only be available at select pharmacies in Peel.

Influenza Vaccine: For influenza vaccines, choose pickup at any designated location or opt for paid delivery if you are part of our vaccine delivery service.

Increasing iGAS in Ontario

On December 15 the Ministry of Heath issued a memorandum regarding an increase in iGAS cases in Ontario compared to Fall 2022. Highest rates are in adults 65 years and older and children 1 to 9. The Region of Peel is experiencing similar trends. The overlap with respiratory season is concerning, as recent viral infection is a risk factor for iGAS.
