












#### Looking at the News





#### IPV in the News

- IPV does not get coverage equal to its frequency as an arrest
- Other violence gets covered more often as an issue
- IPV was represented as more lethal than it is
- IPV coverage is more "murder-centric" than other violence coverage








#### Child Sexual Abuse in the News


- News coverage of child sexual abuse is infrequent
- Coverage focuses on "moments" in the criminal justice process
- Prevention is virtually invisible
- Language describing child sexual abuse is vague and imprecise












