

Housing Services

The Region's focus is on helping people to get and keep housing.

Housing Supports

- Created 10-year plan to increase affordable housing and prevent homelessness by 2028
- Provided **11,456** households with housing subsidies
- Oversees approximately **17,000** subsidized and affordable units
- Manages **14,997** households on the wait list
- Placed **647** households in affordable housing
- **965** affordable housing units being developed
- Affordable housing development incentives pilot
- Ensuring existing stock is in state of good repair
- Technology to help people get the services they need to get and keep housing

Homelessness Supports

To address emergency needs and stabilize people's lives

- **Peel owns or funds 5 shelters – we do not turn anyone away**
- **Shelters:** Cawthra, Peel Family, Wilkinson, Brampton temporary youth shelter
- **11,891** visits (**3,955** clients) to Regionally owned shelters (July 1, 2018 - June 30, 2019)
- **244** beds; **60** units (225 beds)
- **20** beds at **Our Place Peel**
- **Transitional Housing – helping youth and families stabilize in longer-term environment**
- Peel Youth Village (youth), Angela's Place (families) New Leaf (singles)
- **193** clients in transitional housing (July 1 2018 to June 30 2019)
- **86** transitional beds/units
- We provide **eviction prevention funding** to help people stay in their housing
- **Home for Good in Peel – supporting vulnerable individuals with housing and services:**
 - Since 2018, placed 116 individuals and families into stable housing
