IMPORTANT NOTES

Tetanus, Diphtheria and Acellular Pertussis (Tdap)

*One lifetime dose of Tdap is recommended in adulthood. This lifetime dose replaces one of the Td booster doses given every 10 years. It may be given regardless of the interval since the last dose of tetanus-diphtheria containing vaccine.

Polio

Polio vaccine can be IPV (injectable) or OPV (oral). Children with immunization records from other countries may have OPV recorded.

Measles/Mumps/Rubella (MMR)

Children are required to have two doses of MMR given on or after the first birthday to attend school.

Varicella (Chickenpox)

Children born on or after January 1, 2000 are eligible to receive two doses of the varicella vaccine. Children born on or after January 1, 2010 require two doses of varicella vaccine to attend school.

Meningococcal C (Men C)

Children are required to have one dose of Men C given on or after the first birthday to attend school.

Meningococcal ACYW-135, Hepatitis B and Human Papillomavirus (HPV)

These vaccines are offered at school-based immunization clinics.
