(persons who are working)



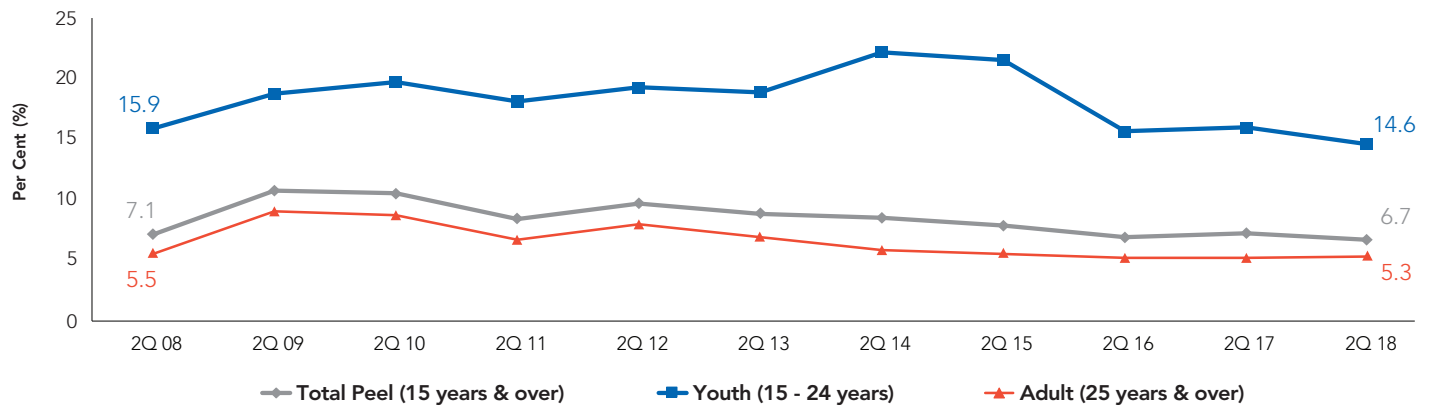

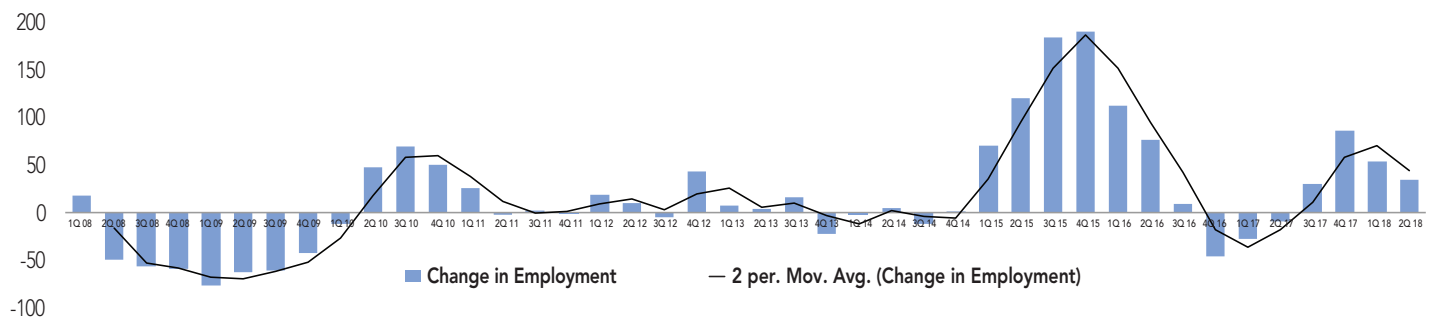
- Positive labour market changes in Peel continues

Continued Decline in Peel's Quarterly Average Unemployment Rate



- At 6.7% Peel's quarterly average unemployment rate was the lowest second quarter unemployment rate on record

Change in Quarterly Average Employment in Peel (in thousands): 2008 – 2018



- Fourth consecutive increase in quarterly average employment in Peel's labour market

Sectoral Changes in Quarterly Average Employment by Major Industries

Goods Producing Industries

Total: 160,600 persons -3.9%



Manufacturing: **-18.2%**

Construction: **+42.9%**

Services Industries

Total: 675,900 persons +6.4%



Trade: **-4.7%**

Transportation and Warehousing: **+27.3%**

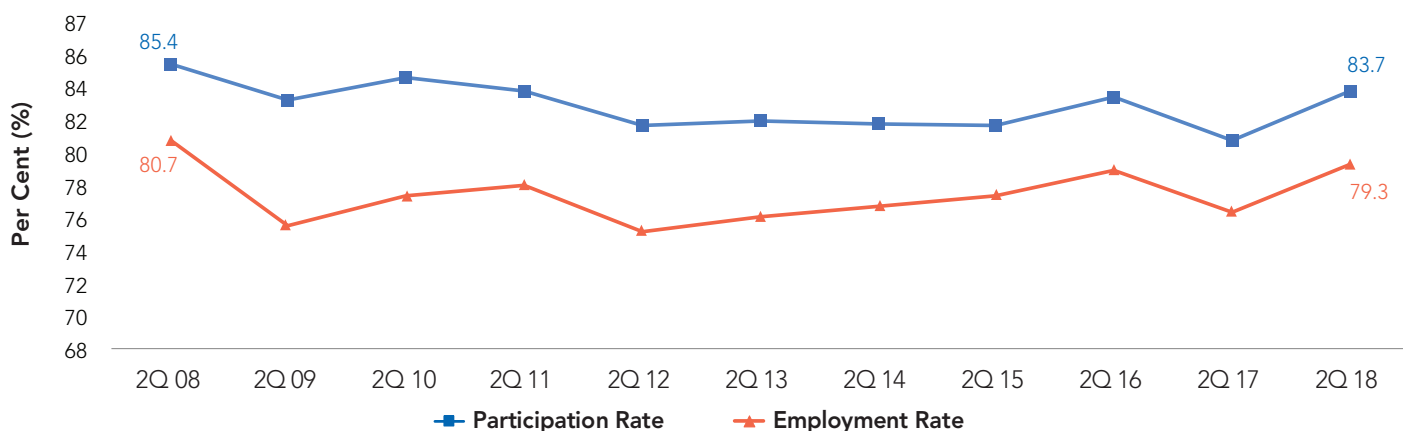

Age Groups	Unemployment Rate	Year Over Year Change (in percentage points)
15-64	6.7%	-0.7
25-64	5.3%	-0.2
20-24	14.8%	1.7
15-19	13.9%	-8.9
